Registrant: YOUNG, Dr. Jack, Registered Psychologist	Nature of Action: A request from and a grant by the registrant of an undertaking or consent to a program of supervision involving a minimum of two and a maximum of four sessions.
	Reasons: A complaint resolved by means of undertaking or consent pursuant to s. 36(1), concerning the registrant providing psychological and other forms of treatment to his own injured employee, raising concerns about one or more breaches of professional standards. Concerns leading to action by the College related to the registrant's knowledge on the status of ethical codes, prohibited dual relationships and the procuring and documenting of informed consent.

The Inquiry Committee commenced an investigation, and made a motion pursuant to s.35(1) of the Health Professions Act for an extraordinary hearing. The extraordinary hearing was

Registrant: BURNSIDE, Dr. Barbara Janice, Registered Psychologist	Nature of Action: A request from and a grant by the registrant of an undertaking or consent to a restriction on practice except under supervision, for an initial period of six (6) months subject to extension.
	Reasons: A complaint resolved by means of undertaking or consent pursuant to s.36(1), concerning the registrant providing psychotherapy services to a client which disclosed a case for one or more breaches of professional standards, including a failure to establish and maintain appropriate therapeutic boundaries, a dual relationship with the client, acceptance of client gifts, inappropriate disclosure of personal and confidential matters, and failure to provide appropriate termination services.
	UPDATE: As of September 17th, 2009 the registrant has complied with all limits and completed all conditions imposed pursuant to the undertaking and consent agreement.

	Reasons: A complaint resolved by means of undertaking or consent pursuant to s.36(1), concerning the registrant's clinical assessment of a patient which raised concerns about one or more breaches of professional standards. Concerns leading to action by the College related to various matters including sufficiency of grounds for his diagnosis, and sufficiency of grounds for his excluding alternate diagnoses.

Registrant: DAVID, Dr. Sara Joy, Registered Psychologist	Nature of Action: A request from and a grant by the registrant of an undertaking or consent to undergo a practice assessment, with particular emphasis on boundary issues and standards of advertising and public statements, and to abide by any recommendations.

	Reasons: A complaint resolved by means of undertaking or consent pursuant to s. 36(1), concerning the registrant failing to maintain appropriate professional boundaries and seeking special benefit by borrowing money from a former client, and concerning advertising prepaid services, inconsistent with the Code of Conduct.

Registrant: McCONNELL, Ms. Kamie Joy, Former Registered Psychological Associate	Nature of Action: An order by the Inquiry Committee under s.35(1) to impose limits and conditions on the registrant's practice of psychology pursuant to the terms of an Undertaking whereby the registrant agreed to not practice psychology or provide psychological services until the complaint is resolved.
	Reasons: A complaint was made by a co-worker of the registrant that the registrant engaged in prohibited conduct by engaging in an inappropriate romantic and sexual relationship with a current or former patient in a correctional setting. The Inquiry Committee commenced an investigation, and made a motion pursuant to s.35(1) of the Health Professions Act for an extraordinary hearing. The extraordinary hearing was settled by the registrant entering into an undertaking and consent agreement that the registrant not practice psychology or provide psychological services until the complaint is resolved.

Registrant: NADEAU, Dr. Jeanne (also known as Joanne Nadeau), Former Registered Psychologist	Nature of Action: A citation was issued on September 17, 2009, but was subsequently withdrawn on October 13, 2009 pursuant to s.37(4) when the College requested and the former registrant granted an undertaking or consent, in the nature of an undertaking or consent agreement that includes: (1) to admit having committed professional misconduct by engaging in a romantic and intimate relationship with an inmate who was a client; (2) not to apply for re- registration with the College for a period of 24 months, and to undergo a fitness assessment if and when Dr. Nadeau does apply; and (3) to agree that upon successful registration Dr. Nadeau will have a restriction on practice, including that she will practice under supervision by a supervisor, according to specific terms, until particular conditions are met.
	Reasons: A complaint, resolved by means of an undertaking and consent pursuant to s.36(1), concerning Dr. Nadeau engaging in prohibited conduct by engaging in a romantic, sexual, or exploitative relationship with a current or former patient in a correctional setting, and failing to cease the prohibited relationship.

The nature of the complaint underlying the citation is as follows: 1) that Dr. Schallow failed to obtain informed consent of the client; 2) that Dr. Schallow disclosed confidential information about the client to the client's husband and third parties without her consent; 3) that Dr. Schallow acted as a consultant for the client's husband in litigation concerning the client's condition, adverse in interest to the client, and failed to withdraw despite a conflict of interest; and 4) that Dr. Schallow used confidential information about the client to assist the client's husband in exchange for a fee.
